STATEMENT IN SUPPORT OF PROF ITAMOCHI KENGO (KOBE, JAPAN) FOR NOMINATION AS CANDIDATE FOR ASSOCIATE MEMBER OF THE ACADEMY

Dear Mr Secretary-General:

It is my greatest privilege and pleasure that I am, as an Associate Member of the Academy, able to write this letter in support of nominating Associate Professor ITAMOCHI Kengo of the Kobe University Graduate School of Law, a comparative law scholar of twelve (12) years' standing, as candidate for Associate Member of the Academy.

I have known Professor Itamochi since 2012 when he was a fresh Assistant Professor (*Jokyō*) at the Graduate Schools for Law and Politics of the University of Tokyo. Since then, despite working in different substantive law fields and jurisdictions, we have kept up a collegial professional relationship¹ that included one major collaborative project, on which I elaborate below. As may be well known, there is a long and storied tradition of Anglo-American law scholarship dating back to the dawn of Japan's modern era in the mid-19th century that is inseparable from that nation's struggle to modernise and renegotiate the unequal treaties forced upon it by the Western powers. Professor Itamochi is very much a member of this grand tradition of generalist comparative law, with much of his solo work to date spanning traditional areas such as real property law in the United States and the civil procedure governing corporate litigation in Delaware courts, but also newer fields such as the law of succession as applicable to posthumously-conceived children in Japanese and US law.

While Professor Itamochi's prior foreign study and research stints in the United States (Georgia) and England (Oxford and Cambridge) and distinguished publication record speaks to his status as an accomplished mid-career scholar within the Anglo-American law tradition of Japan, I would like to highlight something that is, in my opinion, his greatest achievement and contribution to the advancement of comparative law. Specifically, it is his leadership and intellectual contribution on the monumental project to produce the first Japanese-language treatise on Singapore business law, officially titled in English *Introduction to Singapore Business Law* but more idiomatically translated as *The Essence of Singapore Business Law* (*"Essence"*).

Although initially spearheaded by another much more senior Japanese scholar, it was Professor Itamochi who ultimately marshalled a team of 7 other contributors² from academia and legal practice towards successful completion of the project. He mostly single-handedly managed and personally edited the entire 360-page manuscript. In addition, he was the most significant individual contributor, personally writing chapters on the Anglo-common law legal tradition and sources of law; real and personal property law; corporate finance; and corporate insolvency and restructuring – which amount to almost 40% of the book's substantive content. This foray into uncharted waters is unlikely to be repeated anytime soon by

Japanese colleagues working in comparative law and, to my mind, distinguishes Professor Itamochi as a bold pioneer among his scholarly peers in Japan.

As a long-time scholarly colleague who has known him since the beginning of his scholarly career and since then worked closely with him on the *Essence* Singapore law treatise, Professor Itamochi is to me much more than another member of Japan's venerable but somewhat conservative Anglo-American law tradition. While he would, being the paragon of scholarly humility he is, never endorse this view, I personally see Professor Itamochi as someone likely to become within the next few years the figure leading Japan in the generalist study of common law into new jurisdictions and new directions. For example, his ongoing work, which builds on expertise accumulated during the writing of *Essence*, delves into the complex "law in action" around the management and maintenance of collective housing in Singapore as compared to England and Japan – a unique perspective never undertaken before in either Singapore, England, or Japan. His scholarly ability is a given, but it is his courage to forge new paths while doing his part to continue a great and learned tradition that will be a valuable addition to the work of Japan's National Committee and the Academy as well.

For the reasons stated above, I expect Professor Itamochi to be a valuable contributor to the work of the Academy should he be permitted to stand election and be successfully elected. I therefore offer my full and unqualified support of his nomination.
