I write this letter in support of my colleague Professor Daniel Charles PASCOE's application to become an Associate Member of the International Academy of Comparative Law. - International Journal of Applied and Comparative Criminal Justice;
- International and Comparative Law Quarterly;
- Chinese Journal of Comparative Law;
- Indonesian Journal of International and Comparative Law.

Professor PASCOE aspires to be the world's leading scholar of comparative criminal law and punishment in Asia. Indeed, since completing his graduate degrees, he has spent his entire career based in Hong Kong. Aside from City University of Hong Kong, his other academic affiliations include:

- Vocational School, Istanbul Kent University, Member of the Advisory Board (December 2022 – present)
